


Biofuels and land grabbing

- UN: UK third largest land grabber after China and Saudi Arabia with over a million hectares acquired, primarily in Africa.
- Majority of UK acquisitions for biofuels
- Global Land coalition: 44 percent of all global land deals in 2009 for biofuels








5 million hectares in 11 African countries = size of Denmark – are being acquired by foreign companies to produce biofuels.

The practice – known as land grabbing – is increasing and is dominated by European and Chinese companies.









Friends of the Earth Europe's demands:

- Scrap the 10% biofuel target (opportunity in 2014 review)
- No ROCs for biofuels and imported biomass
- EU to start measuring and curbing its use of land, water, materials around the world
- Recognition of community land rights, tight controls on foreign investment and prioritisation of food sovereignty
